## ANZAC day .303 Shoot

NZDA Kaitoke Range Upper Hutt April 25th 2017

Times: Sign in / practice 8:30 - 10:30 Remembrance: 10:45

Competition starts 11:00. Please be there early to sign in and have your rifle checked,

No sign-ins once matches begin.

**Match Director:** Gerry V, **CRO:** Colin W. All matches shot at 100 yards on figure 12 targets



- **Match 1: Trinity – 15rds – Wright’s Hill Cup**

Figure 12 target 5 Shots standing, 5 Shots sitting or kneeling, 5 Shots prone. One minute per position with time to reload.

- **Match 2: Action M – 10rds – Magnum Imports trophy**

Figure 12 target. 2 x 5 rd clips or loose rounds. Start with rifle magazine loaded with 5 rds, bolt closed on empty chamber. Rifle placed on mat with shooter standing to rear of mat. On command, drop and fire 2 rds prone, stand and fire 2 rds, drop sitting/kneeling and fire one round, reload and fire one more round, then stand to fire 2 rds, drop prone to fire last 2 rds. 75 seconds.

- **Match 3: Snap Shooting - 10rds – Western Front trophy**

Figure 12 target. 10 x 4 sec exposures shot from standing alert. On command, fire one round and return to alert position. There will be a pause to reload for the magazine impaired.

- **Match 4: The Mad Minute - 15rds – Johnny Newton trophy**

Figure 12 target, Start prone with hot rifle loaded with 5 Rounds plus 10 rounds loose or in charger clips. One 60 second exposure. Penalty of 3 points off total score per round left over.

- **Match 5: SLR Match – Rapid – 15rds – SLR Trophy**

Fig 12 target, start with hot rifle held at the standing alert, loaded with 10 rounds, bolt closed and safety engaged. Second magazine of 5 rounds staged on mat. On command, fire 5 rounds standing, drop to kneeling fire 5 rounds, drop to prone, reload and fire last 5. 60 seconds total. Open to as issued Commonwealth L1A1 rifles with iron sights only.

The main prizes are reserved for ‘**As Issued**’ service rifles. This means your rifle is as close as is possible to one issued to a typical soldier. Bedding, floating, target sights and other such enhancements are not permitted in service class but may be used in open class.

- Matches 1, 2, 3 & 4 are for the ANZAC day Trophies.
- Match 5 is a stand-alone event for the WSRA SLR trophy
- Other trophies:
  - Cassino – Top score by a current or past NZ Serviceman or woman
  - Galatas – Top score by a competitor over 50 years of age
  - Maddi – Best No4
  - P14 – Best P14
  - Volunteers trophy – Best pre SMLE
  - No5 – Best jungle carbine
  - Anzac trophy – top scoring WSRA member
  - Chunuk Bair – Best SMLE
  - Open class cup.
- **Open class** is only for .303 rifles not fitting into Service class, no other firearms permitted although Service class SLRs may be used. ( BYO Panadol, blue pills and teaspoon of cement)
- Medals awarded for overall 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> aggregates
- .303 & 7.62x51 ammunition will be available for purchase on the day at \$2 and \$1 per round respectively (bring correct cash!)
- Any (safe) full power smokeless 150gr or heavier sporting ammo or reload is permitted in Service class.
- If used, military ammunition should be ball only (no tracer or AP) and of post 1970 manufacture but Greek and Pakistani manufactured hang-fire-special military ammo is NOT permitted for safety reasons.
- All rifles will be checked prior to competition for safe operation (and headspace if required).
- Match director’s decision final.
